The footfall was, as you would expect, well down on previous years but we still had quite a successful day taking a total of £400 in sales and £68.70 in the ever-popular candle-rolling. As well as talking to the locals about bees and our work. We also picked up the details of one volunteer, who is interested in giving a home to a colony of honeybees!

Indoor Meeting – Bumble Bee Conservation

Making a buzz for the Coast – A talk by Lauren Kennedy

Time: 2 – 5pm

A little piece of background to Making a buzz for the Coast:

An exciting new HLF funded project by Bumblebee Conservation Trust working with partners in North Kent to safeguard the rare bumblebees found along the coastline. Many of the bumblebee species within the UK are classed as rare or threatened, this is mainly due to massive losses in wildflower meadows. Working from Dartford to Deal the project aims to create and restore habitat for bees.

Lauren Kennedy (Outreach and Volunteer Officer) will talk about the aims of the project and what they have already achieved. In addition; what rare species are found on the Kent coastline, their ecology/lifecycle and what makes Kent so special for bee populations. Lauren will also talk about how you could be involved with the project and what we can do to help protect and encourage bees.

Education Report:

The Winter Studies group, starting on Monday 22nd October, will be taking a look into many of the important aspects of what bees eat, how they process it and how we harvest those beautiful products of the hive. We will be (loosely) guided by the BBKA syllabus so that any who wish will be prepared for the Module 2 exam next March.

We have 8 MBKA members signed up, plus 4 from Mid-Kent (Swale & Maidstone) and 2 from Gravesend BKA.

Later this month (13th) we will be recognising the achievements of members in BBKA examinations and assessments; come along to raise a cheer!

Beyond that, the National Honey Show at Sandown Park, Esher is running from 25th-27th; there are a series of lectures for all levels and the opportunity to look at really well-prepared show exhibits, plus a full trade hall. Definitely worth a visit.

Notes from The Apiary:

The Apiary is now looking normal and green after the recent rainy spell and the water level in the pond is back to full. We still have five colonies: 2 x National deep, 1 x National 14 x 12, 2 x WBC 14 x 12. However, one of the WBC's has a 14 x 12 National brood box. This will need to be sorted out next season, All the colonies have been treated with MAQS as there were signs of DWV (deformed wing virus) in some of the colonies.

After the MAQS treatment it was found that hive 1 had become queen less (possibly the result of MAQS) and had raised a lot of queen cells. As it is very late in the year we were concerned that the virgin queen might not mate properly if at all. Sheila has a spare queen in

an Apidea and has offered it to make hive 1 queenright. The queen will be introduced during week beginning 23rd Sept. The colonies are now being fed.

We had a very successful Apiary clean-up day on Saturday 1st September. The weather was very warm and ideal for gardening. We had 9 members turn up to help including Simon, one of the neighbours! It was good to see 3 of our newest members there. We managed to burn all of the old fence panels and garden trimmings. At one point I was a little concerned that the smoke from the bonfire might cause a problem for the the light aircraft coming in to land at the local airstrip.


Sheila kept everyone refreshed with tea and bacon rolls and Mel demonstrated her pruning skills – don't ask her to trim your hair!

After the clean-up, the Apiary Open Day started. Bob, Rob and Mark did the hive inspections and new members were encouraged to hold/look at frames and Bob explained what was happening and what to look for (reading the frames). All went well with 4 of the hives, but something had upset hive 5 so a very quick inspection was done. Hive 5 was very noisy and quite angry. We need to keep an eye on this.

It has been noted that the hive equipment shed is not bee/wasp proof. On several inspections members have noticed an unusual number of bees/wasps in the shed. They had found a brood frame with some stores in it. Jen has purchased 3 sealable plastic containers to put super frames in to stop robbing and wax moth
