

What3Words:



If you have an out apiary that could be hard to find, What3Words could be a lifesaver; if you ever need to provide the emergency services with a precise location. It is easier to remember than a grid references and there is less chance of getting it wrong.

What3Words have divided the world into a grid of 3m x 3m squares and assigned each one a unique 3-word address, for example, 'lime.bolt.metro'. This allows it to be used on a smart phone to quickly determine a user's location.

It can be downloaded on iPhone or Android from the App or Play store and will pinpoint your current location. If you don't have access to a smart phone, then your 3-word location can be found in advance from their website: www.what3words.com. It is easy to use and utilises a google maps platform. When it has located your position or you have found it on the computer, it will provide you with the unique 3-word location.

This App is not only useful for emergencies, even if you are just trying to tell someone where an access gate is, or, you are meeting someone at a big event, this can provide you and them with a quick and accurate location.
