Making a buzz for the Coast – A talk by Lauren Kennedy

#### A little piece of background to Making a buzz for the Coast:

An exciting new HLF funded project by Bumblebee Conservation Trust working with partners in North Kent to safeguard the rare bumblebees found along the coastline. Many of the bumblebee species within the UK are classed as rare or threatened, this is mainly due to massive losses in wildflower meadows. Working from Dartford to Deal the project aims to create and restore habitat for bees.

Lauren Kennedy (Outreach and Volunteer Officer) will talk about the aims of the project and what they have already achieved. In addition; what rare species are found on the Kent coastline, their ecology/lifecycle and what makes Kent so special for bee populations. Lauren will also talk about how you could be involved with the project and what we can do to help protect and encourage bees.

The final apiary inspection took place at the end of September and all was well for the coming winter. The apiary is now closed for the winter. We have a team who will undertake monthly inspections to check on food, hive condition and site security. Normal inspections will begin next March / April depending on the weather conditions.

#### **Asian Hornet Update:**



The National Bee Unit is investigating a confirmed sighting of the Asian hornet in Dungeness. The hornets have been seen foraging on Ivy. Please keep up your vigilance by continuing to monitor for any hornet activity, especially on flowering forage. Further information will become available as and when the situation develops.

It is hoped that it may have been blown across the channel by the very high winds earlier in the month.
